All Foundation and Key Stage One pupils receive free school lunches under the Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme, saving you around £400 each year. But did you know that the School's Pupil Premium funding is also linked to families being registered for free school meals?

Last year the school received £1,320 for each registered child.

In challenging financial times this is a valuable resource for us, so if you are eligible we encourage you to apply. Children are eligible for free school meals/pupil premium if their parents are in receipt of certain benefits, including:

- Income Support, or Income-based Job Seekers' Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Universal Credit

Pupil Premium is an important part of the school budget

Full details of how this money was used last year is available on our school website. Examples include: employing additional teaching assistants, enrichment opportunities (supporting trips & visits), classroom resources and OWL. We also use the funding to provide free school meals for eligible children in Key Stage 2, and milk for all children.

Useful information

My child is in Foundation/KS1 and doesn't pay for their lunch- why would I go to the trouble to claim free school meals?	It might seem odd to claim when your child is already receiving free lunches, but registering your child links to the Pupil Premium funding for the school.
How quickly do I find out if my application is successful?	Applications are done online through the government's secure portal using your National Insurance Number to check your earnings. A result is instant. Access to the internet can be provided at school if required.
My KS2 child prefers packed lunch.	Your child does not have to have a school lunch. You can still register to benefit from support in class and money off school trips - this includes educational visits and residential trips so it's well worth it!
I don't want my child to be labelled!	You book and select lunches in exactly the same way as everybody else. All children eat together in the hall – there are no separate queues, so staff and other children are unaware of pupil premium children.
I don't want people to know my circumstances.	You can apply online via the Citizen Portal You don't need to discuss any benefits you receive, or any other personal details, with the school. Any conversations- you may choose to have with staff members- will be treated with the utmost discretion.
