New Recycling Rules:

You may be aware that recycling rules for schools and businesses changed 31.3.2025. As a result, we will no longer be able to accept rubbish from packed lunches, bringing us in line with other schools in the area. This means that crisp packets, sandwich wraps and other non-compostable rubbish must be put back into lunch boxes and taken home. Children will still be able to dispose of fruit waste in school.

This is a perfect opportunity to 'go green' with packed lunches! Sending sandwiches in a reusable plastic container, buying larger bags of crisps which can be decanted at home into pots for lunches and making choices to avoid pre-packaged items as far as possible will help support us to meet our sustainability goals in school and do our bit to take care of our environment.

The Blessing of Easter Breakfasts is a tradition we have marked for many years at Holy Ghost. Swięconka meaning "the blessing of the Easter baskets", is one of the most enduring and beloved <u>Polish</u> traditions on <u>Holy Saturday</u> during <u>Easter</u>.

he tradition of food blessing at Easter, which has early-medieval roots in Christian ociety is said to date from the 7th century in its basic form, the more modern form notaining bread and eggs (symbols of resurrection and Christ) are said to date om the 12th century.

Baskers containing a selection of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white <u>linen or larg</u> napsin and decorated with springs of <u>bowong</u> the hybrical Easter evergener. Families take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens; consistent of the line of th
