#### FOOTBALL IN THE PLAYGROUND: Amendment to our rules

To prevent younger children being hit by the ball:

<u>Before school</u> we can not allow football in the playground. However if your child wishes to play football before school then breakfast club very often facilitates this and you would be welcome to book them in so that they can play at this time.

<u>After School:</u> Football can be played – but not until all younger children have cleared the area, so that there is not a risk of them – or their parents – being hit. Once the area is clear of younger children, then sensible Tiki-taka football is allowed until 5 minutes before the gate is closed and locked at 4pm.
