
St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Home Learning Pack






Food around the world.

Have a look at the document that shows you where around the world certain foods come from.


You may have a world map at home. If not I have attached one for you. Draw each of the foods and use the document to help you place them on your world map.

Tally Charts – Ask your friends and family what their favourite vegetable is. Create a Tally chart. You could make a table.

Then make a graph to show your results – You could use Duplo bricks or small pictures.








Oak children - Number bonds to 10 are really important when building the foundation for addition and subtraction. Recap number bonds to 10 with your child. Get 10 cars or 10 pencils or 10 real objects that are the same. Ask your child to work out what numbers go together to make 10. Start off with 10 items and the split them e.g. if we have 6 items here how many have we got in the other pile to make 10? So 6 and 4 make 10 or 6 + 4 = IO






names


