Harvest Festival

Next week it is Harvest Festival. We are having a Harvest Festival service in school on Thursday 3rd October at 9.10am. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Every year we try to help the families in the local community so we are asking children to bring in a food item which we then give to the Exmouth Food bank. Donations could include: Tinned meat, Cereals, Porridge, Tinned vegetables, Tea bags / Coffee, Milk - long life or powder, Tinned fish, Sugar, Tinned baked beans/ spaghetti, Squash / fruit juice, Tinned rice pudding /Tinned fruit, /Sponge pudding, Custard, Savoury rice, Pasta / noodles / Spaghetti, Pasta sauce, tinned soup, Jelly, Jam, Peanut butter, Honey, Marmite, Washing powder, Washing up liquid, Soap, Shampoo, Toilet rolls or Toothpaste. On Friday 4th October at 9.30am, years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will be attending the Harvest Mass in Church. Everyone is welcome to attend.
