Free fire safety equipment

A working smoke alarm is a vital start when it comes to raising the alarm if there is a fire. A fire safety adviser can come and check and replace any alarms needed – there is no cost to you. For people with additional needs or disabilities, there is specialist kit, such as sensory loss alarms that come with a strobe light and vibrating pad. The fire safety adviser can also supply fire retardant bedding, throws or blankets, carbon monoxide alarms, alarm testers and special timers. All of this is free of charge.
