For children and young people who struggle with reading, whether they have dyslexia, a visual impairment or a disability that makes reading print difficult, a lack of access to books can have serious implications on their ability to learn and develop. It can also be very isolating and impact their confidence, independence and self-worth. Access to audiobooks has proven to be especially necessary during the recent lockdowns. As well as supporting education, audiobooks have an important role to play in boosting mental health. They can allow growing minds to break away from the barrage of news and information overload, providing enjoyment and a way to help them to cope with the world around them.

This collection is full of leading contemporary children's authors, including Michael Morpurgo, Jacqueline Wilson, J.K Rowling, Malorie Blackman, David Walliams, Phillip Pullman – as well as all the classics. Under 16s can also borrow audiobooks from the main collection (over 12,000 altogether).
