## **Mental Health support**

There is a new, free, mental health support initiative. Starting Point is a single point of access service for young people aged 4-17 years who are struggling with their mental health. They have an open referral system, which allows anybody who knows that child to refer. The Starting Point team will be able to provide support and advice and will assist the child or young person to reach the most appropriate service to meet their needs. They then help the individual or family to access these services by supporting them with referrals, attending meetings, and working closely with schools.
