They can take a test on day 5 – if this is negative and they also test negative on day 6, they can come back to school on day 6 providing they are well with no temperature. **Please remember** that day 1 is the day after the symptoms started, or if no symptoms the day after the positive test.

Due to the number of cases we are still wearing face coverings in communal areas and ask that if you are coming into the office please wear a face covering.
