

Welcome to the Autumn Term!

After a happy and busy first week in Foundation, we hope you and your child are beginning to feel settled and very much a part of this year's Foundation Stage at St Joseph's School. Your children have been amazing and we are so proud of the way they have coped with this unusual start to the term.

As a starting topic we will be exploring God's creation of the world around us and how this changes as we approach Autumn. We will also link this with our whole school topic 'Marvellous Minds' which is all about how amazing we all are and how we can recognise and look after our own and each others feelings. Without you coming into the classroom your child is having to be more independent when sorting their belongings. Though they will have some adult support, we shall encourage the children to feel proud when they can achieve things by themselves. This includes taking responsibility for their own possessions. We are establishing routines whereby children are able to ensure snack pots, water bottles and book bags find their place in the classroom. From time to time things may be forgotten or misplaced please ensure that your child's belongings are very clearly named. This helps the adults to quickly identify lost items and return them to your child.

To support your child with independence, please encourage them to learn to eat independently at meal times (when ready using a knife and fork) and to put on their clothes, coats and shoes by themselves.

## Acorn Class –

The children have been very engaged during story time and sharing books is an essential part of developing communication and language skills. Through stories children can express their own thoughts and emotions, learn new exciting words and build the foundations for language development.

All of the children should have their own book bag and they are very welcome to choose a new book each time they are at Nursery. To meet with COVID advice all returned books will be placed 'in quarantine' for at least 72 hours before returning into circulation.
