However, for most children they do not need a big bag, particularly in the younger classes. We are finding that they put big bags on the pegs which take up a lot of room and then everything else falls off and gets moved and they can't find it. On their pegs they only need a coat and PE kit, in the older classes they only need a coat as their PE kits are kept separately. Lunch boxes and water bottles are also kept separately in all classes.
