This week the children all took part in the Big Schools Anti-Bullying assembly online. The children talked about being kind and being 'anti-bullying' ambassadors where they call out bullying behaviour if they see it. Yr 2 have been demonstrating some excellent teamwork and sharing skills following sets of instructions to complete Lego challenges. Yr 3 have been learning all about the skeleton and the role it plays in the body and Yr 4 did an amazing presentation of 'Meerkat Mail'. This is a book which they had been learning and they put actions to it and presented it in KS2 assembly.
