Dear Parents and Carers,

The children have had a super week in school. It has been great to see some of them out there exploring and learning about the frost on the ground. Covid update

We do have a growing number of Covid cases in pupils and staff. It is really important that you get your child tested if they have any symptoms but also regular testing with the lateral flow tests is picking up cases which are asymptomatic. It is really important that these cases are picked up as otherwise they are spreading throughout the class. Many thanks to all those of you who I know have been carrying out the LFD tests regularly. The LFD tests can still be ordered free online or collected from pharmacies.

On top of the usual extra cleaning, sanitising etc in school we have reverted to online assemblies and some classes eating dinner in classes rather than all together in the hall.
